Jazz concert at the Abbaye de Neumünster

What do you get if you put four Londoners together? Well, yes, maybe also four pints of ale, but I mean something else. Most of the time, you will get four active and creative people. This is the case of the four musicians who will come on stage on Monday 9 November at the Abbaye de Neumünster (Rue Münster, Luxembourg Ville). The Francesc Marco Quartet was created in London, where its four young talented components were studying at some point, and is recreated abroad every now and then for special occasions. The four musicians have some common features: a passion for music, academic training, excellent skills, and enough ability to play different instruments and styles. This can be better appreciated by having a look at each of them separately.

Francesc Marco (piano) was born in Tarragona, Catalonia. He grew up in Luxembourg and completed his studies in London, both at the university and at the Royal Academy of Music. He is involved in many musical projects in the UK and abroad, for instance, F-IRE, The Irreverents, and Sunshine Kings. Sometimes he even plays solo, which he did at the Kulturfabrik last February. Zac Gvirtzman studied at Oxford and is very active with a myriad of bands. Although he is a jazzman, two of his favourite styles are gipsy and Balkan music. During his free time, he joins his old mates and plays the clarinet and the saxophone in the Quartet. As for Jiri Slavik, the bass player, he was born in Havirov, Czech Republic. His musical training was completed in Rome and London, where he lived until 2007 when he moved to Paris. Well, maybe it is more accurate to say that he transferred his belongings to Paris: he is always moving around, as he is a member of several music bands, most of them playing different styles. Finally, the multi-instrumentalist Fred Thomas is a son of musicians and a laureate in jazz. Apart from his work as a percussionist with the Quartet, he leads his own Fred Thomas Trio and appears in a number of bands also with uncountable music styles.

Naturally, with these mixed ingredients and the playful curiosity that fuels these artists, the result could only be a programme with mixed sonorities and harmonies, taking rhythms from one source and melodies from another. The repertoire that the band has announced includes Brazilian standards, funk, klezmer, Cuban classics, Eastern European ballads... and, obviously, good old jazz.

Tickets can be bought through **www.luxembourgticket.lu** or on the same evening at the Abbaye. The concert is organised by the Centre Català de Luxembourg with the support of the Spanish Embassy in Luxembourg. The embassy has prepared a whole week of events dedicated to Spain, including the Made in Spain fair at LuxExpo in Kirchberg.


Portugal. The Man at den Atelier
